MON, TUES, THURS: 9 a.m.-12 p.m.

WED: 10 a.m.-1 p.m.

TUES and THURS: 4 -7 p.m.

FRI and SAT: 9 -11 a.m.

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THINGS TO KNOW

- The Youth Development Center will remain first come, first served and each child is allowed 2 hours per day.
- Days and times will vary by Y location. The Youth Development Centers are now open at the Asheville, Corpening, Hendersonville and Reuter locations.
- No outside toys, food or other items allowed.
- The Youth Development Centers are open for ages 6 weeks-8 years, and those ages 5 and older are required to wear a mask. Staff will also be required to wear masks.
- No food will be allowed in the YDC.
- Infants may not remain in car seats. They may not sleep in car seats nor swings.
- Baby bottles must be prepared and ready; staff may not prepare nor warm bottles.

WELCOME BACK

SAFETY FIRST

Each day the following steps will be taken:

- Health screenings for all staff and participants, including temperature check and assessment of symptoms. Children cannot visit the YDC if they have any of the following symptoms:
 - * Temperature over 100.4
 - * Chills, difficulty breathing or shortness of breath, new cough, or new loss of taste or smell
 - * Have a current COVID-19 diagnosis, or been advised to quarantine in relation to COVID-19
 - * In the previous 14 days, had close contact (defined as being within 6' for more than 15 minutes, living in the same household, or providing care for COVID-19 patients without using proper personal protective equipment) with someone who has been diagnosed with COVID-19
- Hand cleaning scheduled and offered throughout the day
- Small ratio of children to staff
- Modified activities to encourage social distancing within the Youth Development Center
- No sharing of toys, food, etc.
- Sanitizing of high use areas and materials throughout the day and at the end of every shift
- Any child who becomes ill while in the YDC will be separated from the larger group and must be picked up promptly by a parent/guardian
